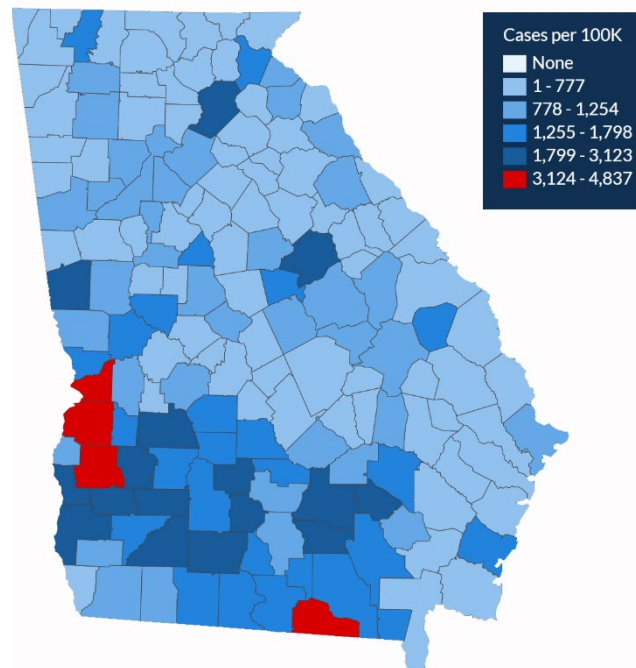

### COVID-19 Update

As Georgia continues to battle the spread of COVID-19, Governor Kemp and state officials are preparing for enhanced testing and hospital surge capacity to ensure the health and well-being of our citizens.

To address ongoing capacity needs, Governor Kemp and state officials will reactivate the Georgia World Congress Center (GWCC) utilizing state-owned assets – hospital beds, medical equipment, etc. – procured at the Governor's direction through the GEMA/HS earlier this year.

First, however, the state plans to leverage a new contract for enhanced bed capacity with a metro-Atlanta area hospital. More details will be provided in the coming days.

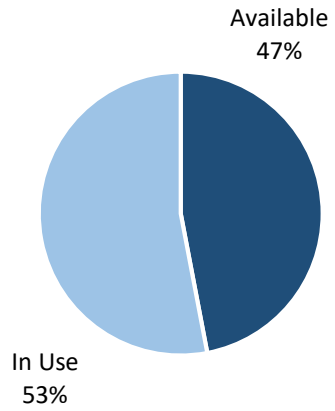

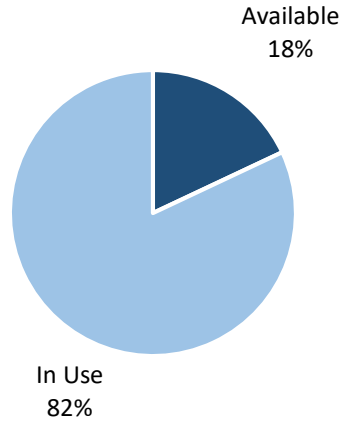

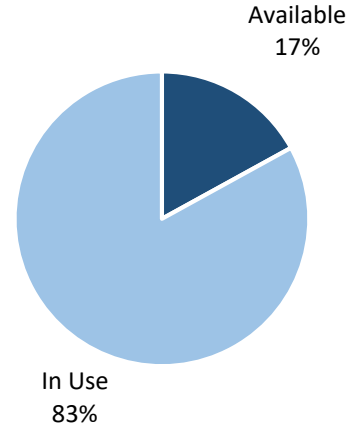
### Percent Capacity of Total ER Beds
